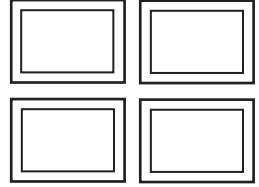


How to Display a Picture

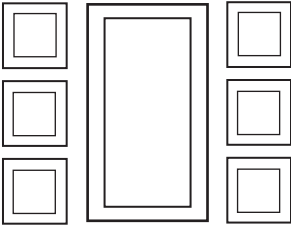
Here are some of the various techniques on how to hang and group your artwork on the wall.

1: Symmetrical Hanging

Symmetrical groupings make a very satisfying pattern and create an architectural feel on the wall. This is effective with identically framed work and although symmetrical, there is an infinite variety of options.



2: Pairing or Grouping

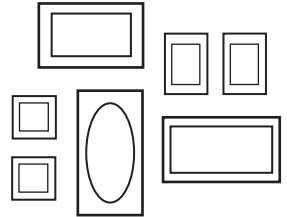


A strong focal point such as a large mirror or large original painting is complemented by smaller paired groupings. This is particularly spectacular over a fireplace or mantle.

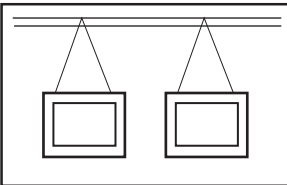
3: Cluster Hanging

A grouping of framed work creates an interesting display.

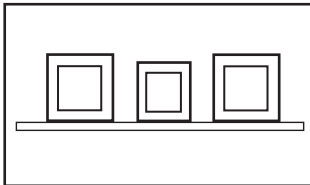
A trick for hanging multiple pieces: Put a large piece of paper on the floor, arrange your pieces on top of the paper in the pattern you will want them on the wall. Trace the edge of each frame. Reach back behind the top of each frame and pull the wire upward. Note with a pen where the top of the wire was--this will be the spot where you should put the picture hook. Once you have marked all of the hanger positions, you can tack the paper on the wall and hammer the picture hangers right through the paper. Tear the paper off the wall and use it as a diagram for where your pictures are to hang in the grouping.



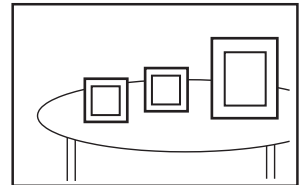
4: Picture Rail...
